

Please also note that as the Conference is held in the run-up to Christmas, we need to confirm final numbers for this dinner by 12 November, *so we strongly advise you to book as soon as possible*.

2. Logistics

2.1 Getting to Leeds

By air

We recommend that you fly to Leeds/Bradford Airport or Manchester Airport, although you will also find train and coach connections from other major transport hubs to Leeds.

a) Via Leeds/Bradford Airport

Metroconnect 757 provides a direct service between Leeds and Leeds Bradford International Airport serving Leeds bus and train stations. The journey takes between 40 minutes and 1 hour, depending on time of day. The service runs every 30 minutes during the day, but less frequently in the early morning and evening. A single ticket from the airport to the city centre is £2.70. Taxis: A taxi trip from the airport to the city centre will cost approximately £20.00. Taxis will be available at the airport, but can also be pre-booked by visiting <http://www.arrowprivatehire.co.uk/>

b) Via Manchester

There is a direct train connection from Manchester Airport to Leeds. If flying in and out of Manchester, we recommend that you buy a return ticket as this will be considerably cheaper than buying two single tickets. Train timetables and fare information can be found at <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/>

c) Via London

If you are flying to one of London's airports, you will need to travel to the City Centre. Trains to Leeds depart from Kings Cross Station in London. If you require a return ticket to Leeds from London, we recommend that you book as early as possible in order to be able to take advantage of cheaper rail fares. Train timetables and fare information can be found at <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/> If you buy tickets online,

you will be able to collect the tickets at the departure station from a ticket machine. You will need the credit card which was used to make the booking or the booking reference number.

By train

We recommend that you book as early as possible in order to be able to take advantage of cheaper rail fares. Train timetables and fare information can be found at <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/> If you buy tickets on-line, you will be able to collect the tickets at the departure station from a ticket machine. You will need the credit card which was used to make the booking or the booking reference number.

2.3 Getting to the Conference

The University campus is fifteen minutes by foot from the heart of Leeds city centre. The location is shown on the attached city map. More information can be found at http://www.leeds.ac.uk/visitors/getting_here.htm

The Headrow is located in the Centre of the City. The Art Gallery is signposted from various locations in town in the City. The Henry Moore Institute is adjacent to the Art Gallery.

2.4 Getting around

Leeds City Centre is compact and it is easy to get around on foot. If required, there is a taxi rank located at the University main entrance (outside the Parkinson Building (no 60 on the campus map). Buses no 1, 28, 56, 96 and 97 from the City Centre stop outside the Parkinson Building, and a bus stop for buses into town is also located on Woodhouse Lane, close to the Parkinson Building. 2.5 Accommodation in Leeds

2.6 Cash Machines/banks

A number of cash machines are located in the Leeds University Union (building 32), and one is also provided at the Marjorie and Arnold Ziff Building which is adjacent to the Michael Sadler Building. There are also a number of banks with cash machines and money changing facilities on Woodhouse Lane/Blenheim Terrace, opposite the Parkinson Building.
